



## Master's Degree Program Cost

**Tuition:** \$200 per semester hour or \$600 per course for 2016-2017

**Books:** Approximately \$100 per course

**Total Estimated Tuition and Books:** Approximately \$8,400

### Third World Student Tuition Discount:

Most third world students will qualify for our RMSMT Third World Student Discount which gives up to a 75% tuition discount on our Master's Degree courses. This results in the following costs:

**Tuition:** \$50 per semester hour or \$150 per course for 2016-2017

**Books:** Approximately \$100 per course

**Total Third World Student Tuition and Book Cost:** Approximately \$3000

## Master's Degree Program Time for Completion

Although it is possible to complete the Master of Arts in Biblical Studies or the Master of Arts in Christian Ministry in two years by taking two courses per semester year round (three semesters per year), most students prefer to take only one course per semester. Taking one course per semester would allow the student to finish in four years.

The courses are rigorous and, as such, those in ministry or working occupations in addition to taking courses may wish to limit their course load to one course per semester. There is no time limit for completing either Master's Degree program nor is there a requirement for students to take semesters in any sequence or in a consecutive manner. However if the student wishes to transfer credit to Lincoln Christian University, the courses transferred must have been completed within ten years of the date of transfer.

## Course Formats

Courses at RMSMT are available in face-to-face, online, intensive, and distance education formats. Students are encouraged to take classes face-to-face in residence or to take advantage of our 3 to 4 day intensive/online hybrid courses. These different formats allow students to take courses from anywhere around the world.

**I. Master of Arts in Biblical Studies**  
(36 Semester Hours, 12 Courses of 3 Credits Each)  
*Prerequisite: Approved Bachelor's Degree in any discipline*

### Required Core Courses:

This class surveys the contents and backgrounds of all the books of the Christian Old Testament.

#### [NT600 Introduction to the New Testament](#)

This class surveys the contents and backgrounds of all the books of the Christian New Testament.

#### [CT611 Introduction to Christian Theology](#)

This class surveys Christian theology and doctrine in the Bible both from an historical perspective as well as a systematic perspective

**OR**

#### [CT696 Introduction to Christian World View and World Religions](#)

This class surveys the principles and beliefs (doctrines) of the Christian World View in the Bible in contrast with other World Religions

#### [GB615 Biblical Hermeneutics and Exegesis](#)

This class gives principles of Biblical Interpretation and teaches proper biblical exegesis of the Bible text

#### [CH600 Church History](#)

This class surveys the history of the Christian Church from its inception in the first century AD to today

#### [AP600 Christian Apologetics](#)

This class teaches principles of defending and promoting the Christian Faith

**Elective Courses:** Choose any 6 courses from General Bible (GB), New Testament (NT), Old Testament (OT), Christian Theology (CT), Church History (CH), and Christian Apologetics (AP) Departments. Three courses from the Christian Ministry (CM) Department may be allowed to fulfill three of the required 6 elective courses. Students are encouraged to choose GB700 (Capstone Paper) as one of their electives courses.

**2. Master of Arts in Christian Ministry**  
(36 Semester Hours, 12 Courses of 3 Credits Each)  
*Prerequisite: Approved Bachelor's Degree in any discipline*
